

Throughout the Bible and Church History the discipline of fasting has often been practised during times of prayer and intercession by people of every denomination.

One of the traditional occasions to fast has been during the season of Lent.



As part of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke to his disciples:

"When you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret." (Matthew 6 v 17-18)

From these words of our Lord, we can see that fasting is a normal part of discipleship – but it is not intended for everyone. He is not saying "You must fast!" For some people, particularly those who are sick, fasting from food is completely inappropriate. Yet for others Jesus is clear that fasting may well play an important role in the life of worship alongside prayer and giving. And that it is to be done for Him alone and not for the praise of those around us.

There is no one way to fast. Some people may feel able to go without food for a full day – others will skip one meal in order to spend time in prayer or worship. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are ideal days to begin this process of fasting if the practice is new to you. It is important to remember that fasting is recommended for food alone – it is essential to drink regularly. It is not a hunger strike!

But there are other kinds of fasts. Last year Pope Francis issued a statement to the Roman Catholic Church called "Do you want to fast this Lent?"

He then wrote

Fast from hurting words and say kind words.

Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.

Fast from anger and be filled with patience.

Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.

Fast from worries and have trust in God.

Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.

Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.

Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.

Fast from grudges and be reconciled.

Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

May God bless you this Lent as you seek to come closer to Him, in worship, prayer or fasting.

Income from the Sale of the Church Field



Christ Church has been considering three projects that the income from the sale of the church field will be spent on.

- 1. A complete refurbishment of the existing church to make it suitable for use as a community centre and a place of worship.
- 2. A complete refurbishment of the existing church hall for use as a community centre with the addition of a new worship space.
- 3. A new modern purpose-built church and community centre located in the remaining unsold area of the church field.

Christ Church have maintained for the last several years that there can only be one building out of the three options above that will be maintained on an ongoing and future basis.

However this is a conservation area so there will be limitations on the remaining building(s).

The church welcomes views from the community on these options and you are invited to send comments to

- * The Plan B Covid measures came to an end in January which means that face coverings in places of worship are no longer mandatory. Thank you to all who have complied with these regulations. Let's hope that 2022 will be a year largely free from restrictions, in contrast to the previous two years!
- * Lent Groups begin this month. Two groups will be held for five weeks from week commencing March 7 Monday evenings in the Barritt Room and on Zoom and Thursday afternoons at CCW hall. Both meetings will be in person although online may also be available on Mondays. The material used will be the Church of England's "Live Lent Embracing Justice" booklet. I have some copies available if anyone would like one.
- * St.Stephen's Elton are hosting a Seder Meal in the Wednesday of Holy Week April 13 beginning at 7.30pm. Further details about this will be available in next month's magazine. Our Holy Week services include 7.30pm Communion services at both churches on Maundy Thursday and 9.00am and 2.00pm services on Good Friday at Christ Church and St.John with St.Mark respectively.
- * A reminder that at 10.30am on the third Sunday of each month a service of Morning Worship / Café Church will take place at St.John with St.Mark. There will be a service of Holy Communion in church at 8.30am that day each month.
- * Mission Communities continue to develop across the Diocese. A meeting has been arranged this month to discuss the position of MC leaders. Every church community is expected to appoint a Focal Leader. These can be lay or ordained and will be developed, trained and supported to work with others to lead the mission, growth and pastoral care of their church. A meeting is taking place at Bolton Parish Church on Wednesday 9 March beginning at 7.00pm to give people an opportunity to ask questions and enter into the conversations about these new roles. Everybody is welcome.
- * Churches Together in Bury represent most of the Christian Churches in the town. The group meets every two months, with a prayer group which meets fortnightly. They have now begun to meet in person

- again. Anyone is able to attend these meetings. Details are in the Bulletin / News Sheet in the relevant weeks.
- * The Men of the Benefice (MOB) meet on the last Monday of each month. We gather at the Towler Inn from 8pm. This will not happen in March as it is Lent, however another event may be considered.
- * The Parish Office is open every Wednesday evening between 6.30-7.00pm at St.John with St.Mark Church Hall. This can be for enquiries about baptisms or weddings or any other matter.
- * Porch Boxes are always in need of food and toiletries especially in this current situation. A box is available at the back of both churches. Thanks to those who support those in need.
- *The Ministry Team consisting of all the Clergy, Licensed Readers and our Authorised Lay Minister meet every month usually on the second Monday evening. If you have an issue that you would like us to discuss, please contact one of the team.
- * Regular attenders to church are encouraged to join our planned giving scheme. If you would like to do so or would like some further information, please speak to one of the Treasurers

The Egg that shares the Easter story

The Real Easter Egg was first launched in 2010. Two years earlier, David Marshall the creator of the Meaningful Chocolate Company, was given a chocolate Easter Egg. On the side of the box it read: 'Easter is the festival of chocolate and loveliness'. He began to wonder – was it right for the manufacturer of an Easter egg to change the meaning of a religious festival in this way? Imagine the outcry if this had been done to Christmas.

He began the search for an Easter egg which mentioned the Christian story of Easter. It became clear that out of the 80 million eggs on sale there was not a single manufacturer who was willing to mention the religious aspects of the festival. Surely there had to be a place for one Easter egg which mentioned Jesus?

As no one was willing to consider this, The Meaningful Chocolate Company was formed. Since then, the company has produced Easter Eggs and Advent Calendars to celebrate two great Christian festivals with chocolate. By Easter 2022 more than 1.8 million eggs will have been sold.

The Real Easter Egg is sold with an Easter story activity book covering the final week of the life of Jesus and includes the events of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. The book contains a prize competition worth £200.

IN MEMORIAM: Kath Parkinson

Kathleen Davenport was born on 9 April 1930 in Bury. The youngest of three children she was born ten years after her sister Mary. The family lived in Fairy Street just off Ainsworth Road.

Kath's mother died when she was only 5, leaving her father and a live in housekeeper to look after the family. Kath left school at 14 to train as a tailor / seamstress, beginning work at Arnott's in Crompton Street.

It was through a friend of Kath's called Brenda that she began to attend church services and social events at Christ Church, Walmersley, linking up with a strong friendship group that included a young Stan Parkinson. The group would go to the pictures or speedway at Belle Vue and spent time listening to each other's records. In time Stan & Kath became a couple and they were married at Christ Church in August 1952 setting up home in Sefton Street. They remained there for the rest of their lives.

Stan was a teacher – later becoming a head teacher – and was a stalwart of Christ Church. At the time of his death in 2013 he was a Church Trustee. Kath left her work at Arnott's as Stan's career continued and she volunteered at the WRVS and Age Concern for over 30 years.

Kath & Stan were not blessed with children of their own, but they did foster a number of children. They also took into their care a next door neighbour's daughter Karen and that relationship continued to the end of Kath's life. Karen & her husband Richard and their daughters Tracey & Katrina were part of Kath's family and she in turn was loved by them.

Kath played a full part in the life of Christ Church, Walmersley both spiritually and socially.

She died after a short illness on 10 January 2022. At her funeral service in Christ Church a month later, Nigel Silvester gave the eulogy noting that the faith which began in childhood carried Kath through her whole life.

We give thanks to God for Kath Parkinson and her life of Christian witness and service. May She Rest In Peace and Rise in Glory.

St. John with St. Mark PCC meeting of 25th January 2022

- Our meeting opened with prayer and an opportunity to remember David Andrew, as this was the first meeting since David passed away in December 2021.
- The pantomime dates were confirmed as now being from Thursday 10th to Saturday 12th March, after being postponed from January.
 There will ne no Thursday evening Communion service that week.
 There are some DBS's to be sorted before then.
- The fit and proper person forms required by PCC members are now almost all in.
- The faculty to remove the pews from the back of Church, which are currently positioned down the side aisles, has been submitted and we are awaiting a Diocesan DAC meeting and discussion.
- Ian used the meeting to give us an overview of the draft accounts for 2021 and the budget for 2022, including the Parish Share proposal for the next three years. There were no issues arising from the accounts and thanks were recorded to Ian for his usual detailed outline.
- The Vicar informed us that a meeting had recently taken place concerning the new Mission Communities in this area of the town.
 Focal leaders are being sought for the Parishes and a meeting to discuss this further will be held on Wednesday 9th March at Bolton Parish Church.
- It was recommended that we update our list of First Aiders for Church, and anybody with an up to date certificate is asked to contact the Wardens.
- The proposed date for the Summer Fair is Saturday 28th May, which is the week before the Jubilee weekend.
- The next PCC meeting will be on Thursday 17th March at 8.00pm and the APCM will be held after the Sunday service on 1st May around 12noon.

MORE NOTES FROM THE COUNCILS

Christ Church PCC meeting 26th January 2022

David Peters reported on discussions with the band and it was agreed to plan concerts for 7^{th} May and 10^{th} December with hire of band at a cost of £350 and maybe a singer.

The vicar spoke of the lifting of Covid plan B restrictions. Christ Church will continue with the arrangements in place at present apart from the use of a purificator instead of tissues.

Crux is planned to restart from Easter and be free. It was decided to order 150 copies to go with the church magazines. If people do not want to receive it in the future they should say. Jane Monks, the diocesan registrar, wrote to thank us for payment of her invoice.

The Treasurer presented the annual accounts, with minor alterations to the draft previously circulated. It was ageed they should be sent to our Independent Examiner. The parish share for 2022 is confirmed at £31,000. There is an incentive for paying in full quarterly.

It was agreed by the PCC that we pay Jane Monks latest bill.

The treasurer's report was accepted, proposed by Trish Stokes and seconded by Geoff Stokes; all were in favour.

A report on the options for Contactless payments in church was presented by Barbara Taylor. After discussion of the equipment and the location in church it was agreed to purchase the equipment - proposed by Barbara Silvester, seconded by Lillian Lees, all were in favour.

The recent revision of the Church Hall hiring rules was discussed and the Hall committee to bring an amended agreement to the next meeting for approval. It was decided to dispose of the freezer in the church hall kitchen as it is not in good condition. A larder fridge was proposed as a more useful alternative. The sale of Christ Church field to Morris Homes is proceeding and is conditional depending on a number of points in the contract.

Jennifer Wood proposed holding an event in aid of Bury Hospice, bringing the involvement by Friends of Clarence Park further north. It was considered we could have a picnic in the field for families with a youth band during the summer holidays. The PCC agreed in principle and await further information, no dates are set as yet.

The next PCC is the 21st March 2022 in Church.

Christ Church Annual Parochial Church Meeting is on the 16th May in Church.

As we begin this penitential season of Lent, a prayer seeking forgiveness.

Forgive those things we have done which have caused you sadness, and those things we should have done that would have brought you joy. In both we have failed ourselves, and you.

World Day of Prayer

2022 is a special year for the World Day of Prayer in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, who have prepared this year's service. Normally marked on the first Friday in March, in Bury this year the service will be held on **Friday 18 March** at **2pm** in **Christ Church Walmersley**.

The service is based on the letter that the prophet Jeremiah wrote to the exiles in Babylonia. In the midst of all the uncertainties we are living under due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the WDP 2022 theme is an invitation to place our trust in God in times of suffering.

The EWNI Committee writes: "It has been both challenging and rewarding to write about our landscape, people and culture all shaped by our history. We celebrate our diversity and the contribution made to our countries by the many groups and individuals who have made their home here. We reflect on some of the issues facing us today: poverty, domestic abuse and disability, finding hope in difficult situations and encouragement in the help we can give to each other."

The artwork by Angie Fox depicts **Freedom**, represented as an open door to a pathway across an endless open vista; **Justice**, represented by broken chains; God's **Peace and Forgiveness**, represented by the dove of peace and a peace lily breaking through the pavement.

Over all, a rainbow which has come to represent all these things from the story of Noah through to the modern day. It is a symbol of the overreaching love of God.

'I Know the Plans I Have For You' Jeremiah 29:1-14

Christian Aid Week is an annual event across the United Kingdom and beyond - involving fundraising, prayer and action against global poverty.

Christian Aid is a charity which works with 700 local organisations around 50 countries in the world. They help poor communities and enable them to deal with hardships, from climate change and the possible threat of natural disasters.
